Congratulations to the following students for receiving the Most Improved Attendance Awards:

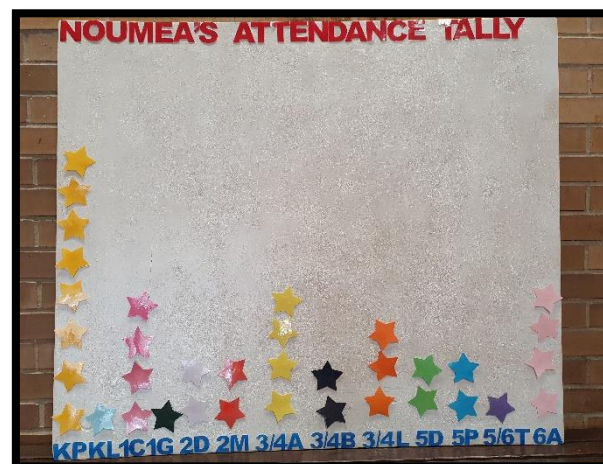
